Dear Sisters and Associates,

In our everchanging world, in which there is joy and sadness, suffering and solace, there is one constant, the God of Love. The call to be touched by grace led us deeper into the heart of God. Ven. Mary Potter reminds us to turn to God as to a Mother whose love so embraces us that we are comforted, challenged and encouraged to let our lives, too, be lives of love (H,22). Why? Because

Love is the beginning and end of all things.

A mother's love is generative and creative, a source of life but also a presence with and for, in good times and bad. This is indeed the love God has for all God's people. In this time of global pandemic, our world sorely needs us to remember this teaching of our Foundress.

Ven. Mary Potter did not turn from the reality of suffering that she saw in the world of her time. Indeed, it was through that very reality God called her to shape her Little Company as women willing to be bearers of love to a world in need, that all might find life in God. Just as surely did she call the Greater Company to that same working of love. For Mother, love is the greatest moving power on earth (H,22).

Love is a source of life and hope but most importantly, it is the source of compassion. The women of Calvary stand in solidarity with the dying Jesus. Theirs is a compassion born of love for the one who had called them to Love and *(our) place likewise, is in the Heart of Jesus (Mary's Conferences 1)*.
